

## KEY INITIATIVES

Council's water and sewer network is mainly located in our existing urban areas east of the M1 Motorway, with the drinking water supply catchments located to the west of the M1 Motorway. On average 133,000 properties are connected to our water supply system and 130,000 to the sewerage system. Approximately 96 percent of the total Central Coast local government area population is provided with a reticulated water supply and sewerage services.

Council prepares Development Servicing Plans (DSPs) to ensure that a strategic plan is in place to service future planned growth, and to provide a revenue mechanism to fund the assets. Following the identification of required capital works in the relevant servicing plan, a decision is made on when the asset is required to be built. Determining the required timing is a balance between avoiding delays to development, while not depreciating assets which are not providing a service to the community.
