Zones Summary

In 2006, the State Government created a common structure and language for LEPs by adopting a Standard Instrument (SI) template for all of NSW.

What zones are used in CCLEP?

The zones included in the draft Central Coast Local Environmental Plan (CCLEP) are consistent with the SI and are a combination of the zones included in *Wyong Local Environmental Plan 2013* (WLEP 2013) and *Gosford Local Environmental Plan 2014* (GLEP 2014). Those properties zoned under the GLEP 2014 or WLEP 2013 will retain their current zone. These zones include:

Is land being rezoned under the CCLEP?

The only land proposed to be rezoned under the draft CCLEP is those lands that were deferred from the GLEP 2014 that did not have a SI zone, or where there was a minor mapping anomaly which required rectification. Those deferred lands are to be zoned to a SI zone based on the recommendations of the Environmental and Urban Edge Zone review undertaken by the former Gosford City Council.
