

Davistown and Empire Bay Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan

Engagement summary

Between 10 October and 13 December 2019 Central Coast Council looked to the community for feedback to help develop the draft Davistown and Empire Bay Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan.

A community questionnaire (prepared by the flood consultant) and information sheet was posted out to residents in Davistown and Empire Bay. A link to this questionnaire was also available on Council's online engagement hub, Your Voice Our Coast, and anyone who lives, works or visits Davistown or Empire Bay were also invited to answer the questionnaire.

Two evening drop-in information sessions were held at Davistown and Empire Bay.

The community raised the following themes around what is important to them when it comes to managing flooding:

- Increasing community awareness and understanding of the local flood risk
- Minimising impacts on water quality
- Preventing new management measures from causing negative flood impacts to other locations
- Requiring minimal cost to Council and the community.

What's next?

We are currently reviewing the submissions we received during community consultation.

The feedback received will help us develop the draft study and plan, which will go on public exhibition for the community to have their say once again.

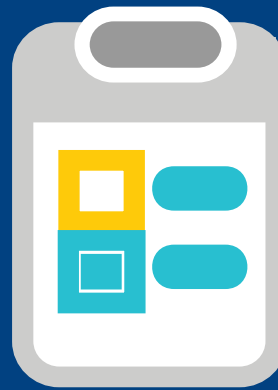
