Summary

Between 18 January and 15 February 2023 Central Coast Council sought community feedback by publicly exhibiting the Woy Woy Peninsula Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan.

Central Coast Council, with the support of the NSW Government's Floodplain Management Program, prepared a Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan (FRMSP) for the Woy Woy peninsula including Kahibah Creek catchment.

The draft report was prepared following detailed analysis of the feedback we received from our first round of community consultation in 2021, and an assessment of potential flood risk management measures.

We invited the community to attend an in-person drop-in information session, schedule a call-back service from a project officer and submit feedback via the online submission form.

Engagement Results

Feedback received throughout the exhibition period included:

- *comments about stormwater upgrades (drains, curbs, gutters, footpaths)*
- *concerns over development*
- *concerns about environmental protection*

45 people attended the community drop in session in Woy Woy.

The Floodplain Management team along with the flood consultants will assess the submissions received, amend the draft reports as required and then finalise this Woy Woy Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan. The final reports will be presented to Council for adoption highlighting any major changes to the draft reports. We will inform the community of the finalised plans in the coming months.
